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Q: Pr. 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Research Seminar

Prof. Sabri Boubaker "Overcoming Rejections: Tips and Tricks for Manuscript Success."

Prof. Md Akhtaruzzaman: "Decoding Scholarly Excellence: Mastering the Introduction in Scientific Research."



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Prof. Akhtaruzzaman conducted a comprehensive training session for our faculty, focusing on the critical role of a compelling introduction in shaping the entire research paper. During the session, he provided invaluable insights and guidelines on how to craft effective and impactful introductions. Drawing on examples from various disciplines, he elucidated the key components of an introduction. These included clearly articulating the research problem, providing a concise literature review, and outlining the significance of the study. Attendees gained practical strategies for engaging readers and learned how to clearly state research objectives. In his concluding remarks, he emphasized the delicate balance between brevity and informativeness. He underscored the importance of being succinct while offering a roadmap for scholars to captivate their audience from the outset, thereby contributing to a coherent and impactful research paper.



Prof. Boubaker offered valuable insights into the challenges faced by authors and provided practical strategies for coping with rejections. He emphasized the crucial role of authors in navigating rejection by seeking constructive feedback, and strategically targeting alternative journals.

A comprehensive overview of the peer-review process was presented, highlighting the importance of understanding reviewer comments, and using them to enhance the quality of manuscripts.

Attendees gained insights into common reasons for rejections, including methodological issues, lack of novelty, and misalignment with journal scope, among others. Overall, the training session equipped participants with tools to navigate the complexities of the publication journey, fostering a proactive approach to rejection and enhancing the likelihood of successful future submissions.
