

COVID-19 Travel Restrictions (Australia) - 29 April 2020

Australia's borders are currently closed.

There are however limited flights for Australians returning home to Australia.

There is a 14 day compulsory quarantine period at a designated location.

Most airlines have suspended flights in and out of Australia other than for repatriation.

Borders between the various States in Australia are being strictly controlled.

Travel within Australia is limited to essential travel only.

A 14 day quarantine period may apply, depending on the State/region.

Travellers (other than Australian nationals)

Foreign nationals wishing to travel to Australia must have a compelling reason linked to assisting with COVID-19 and would need to acquire special permission (from Australian Border Force or the Australian Commonwealth Government)

All travellers arriving in Australia must undertake a mandatory 14-day quarantine at designated facilities in their port of arrival.

Travel restrictions are subject to change.

Airlines

Qantas – suspended until at least June

Virgin Australia– suspended until at least June

Singapore Airlines – suspended

Etihad - suspended

Qatar – limited flights into Australia for eligible passengers

Dates

No date has been fixed for the reopening of borders (domestic or international).

It could take at least six months for international borders to open up.
