



STREAMLINED RECOGNITION OF *DIPLÔME D'INGENIEUR* IN AUSTRALIA



In January 2019 a memorandum of understanding was signed between Engineers Australia and the Commission des Titres d'Ingénieur to facilitate the recognition of French engineering degrees in Australia.

French Engineers can now benefit from a streamlined assessment pathway, without having to write a Competency Demonstration Report, provided that they hold an eligible qualification.*

You will need to provide only a piece of ID, a CV, a copy of your degree certificate and full transcript and a translation of the documents if they are not in English.

Planning to migrate to Australia and need your skills recognised as part of your visa application?

- Apply for the Migration Skills Assessment! Follow the instructions for recognised international qualifications.

* All French *Diplômes d'ingénieur* are eligible, if completed in or after 1970 and listed in the *Journal Officiel de la République Française* in the list of institutions accredited to award the title "Ingénieur" for the year of completion of the degree.

** France is not a signatory of the Washington Accord. However, the assessment process used for the French degree is the same as for the Washington accords qualifications
