

## STREAMLINED RECOGNITION OF DIPLÔME D'INGENIEUR IN AUSTRALIA







In January 2019 a memorandum of understanding was signed between Engineers Australia and the Commission des Titres d'Ingénieur to facilitate the recognition of French engineering degrees in Australia.

French Engineers can now benefit from a streamlined assessment pathway, without having to write a Competency Demonstration Report, provided that they hold an eligible qualification.\*

You will need to provide only a piece of ID, a CV, a copy of your degree certificate and full transcript and a translation of the documents if they are not in English.

## Planning to migrate to Australia and need your skills recognised as part of your visa application?

<sup>\*</sup> All French Diplômes d'ingénieur are eligibile, if completed in or after 1970 and listed in the Journal Officiel de la République Française in the list of institutions accredited to award the title "Ingénieur" for the year of completion of the degree.

<sup>\*\*</sup> France is not a signatory of the Washington Accord. However, the assessment process used for the French degree is the same as for the Washington accords qualifications
