

 Mandatory recordation requirement

> All trade marks relating to goods to be imported in Kenya <u>must</u> be recorded with the ACA regardless of whether they are registered in Kenya or elsewhere.

 Trade marks applied on locally made goods may also be recorded.



Applications for recordation

- Prescribed form applications, accompanied by a duly certified registration certificate in the Applicant's name plus prescribed fee.
- Details of the application for recordation:
 - applicant's details;
 - places of manufacture of the goods bearing the recorded trade mark;
 - Samples/photos of the goods with details to enable differentiation of the same from counterfeits;
 - details of any foreign trade mark licensees or any related foreign companies that use the trade mark abroad.



 Approval or Denial of Recordation Applications

- Notified to applicants through a notice in the Anti Counterfeit Newsletter.
- Recordations are effective from the date of their approval and remain valid for a year from the date of approval or for the period of the registration of the trade mark whichever is shorter.
- The recordation also terminates upon cancellation of the recorded trade mark.



Certification

 Upon fulfilment of all recordation requirements, the ACA is required to issue a certification mark in the form of an anti-counterfeit security device at a fee to be set out in the Second Schedule to the Act.

 Integrated Product Marking and Authentication System



Seizure and Destruction

The ACA is granted power to seize and destroy any goods originally imported into Kenya and found in Kenya without the anti-counterfeit security device.
