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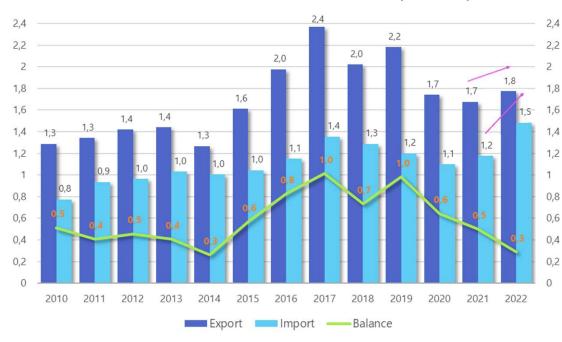

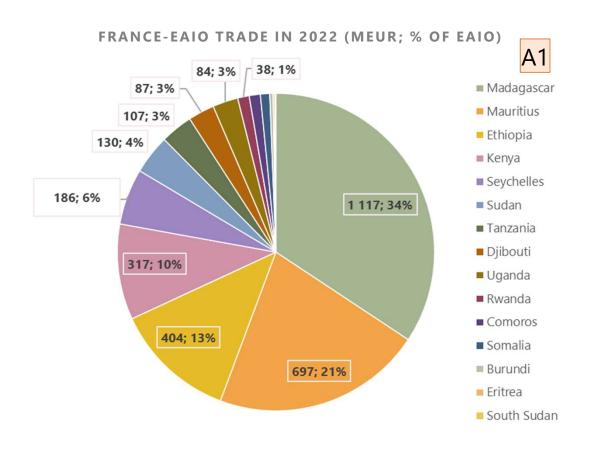

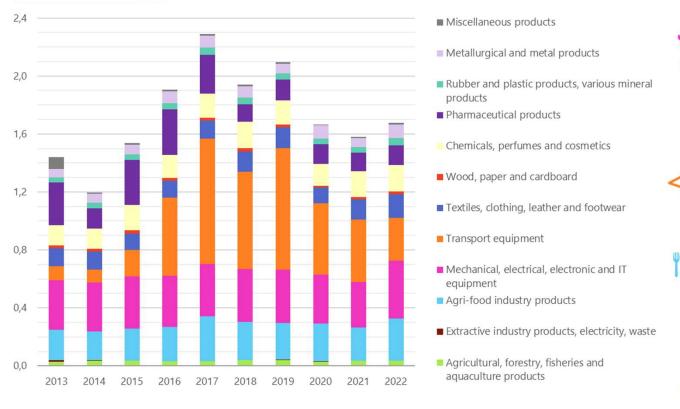

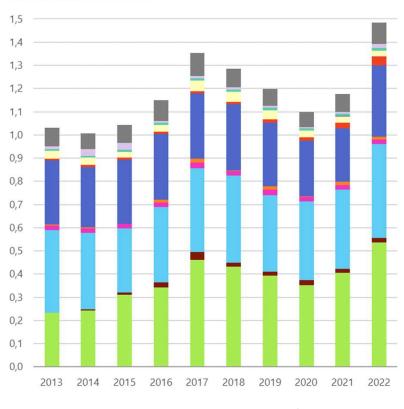

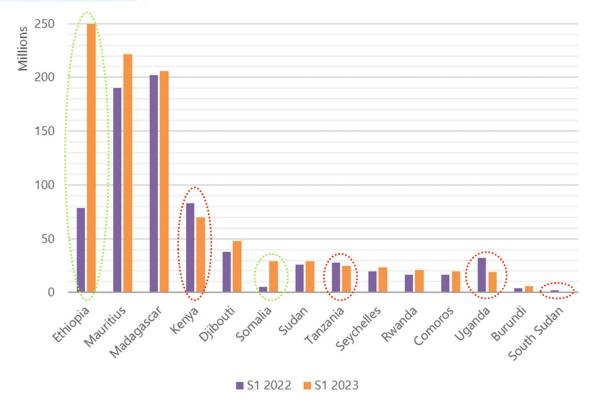

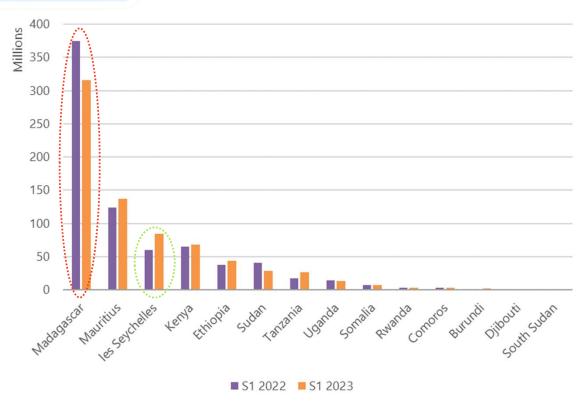

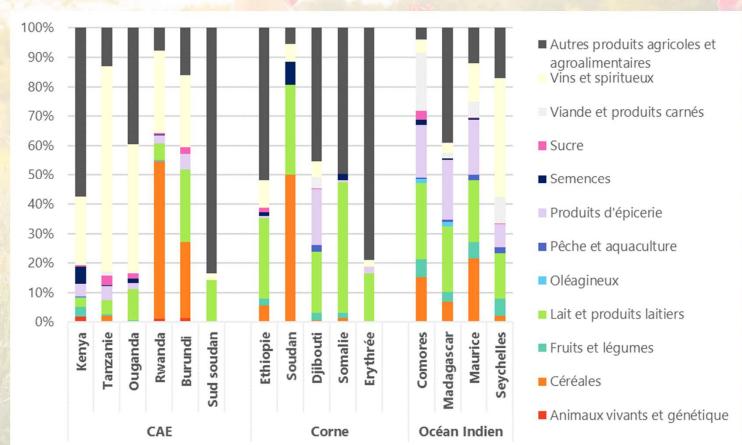

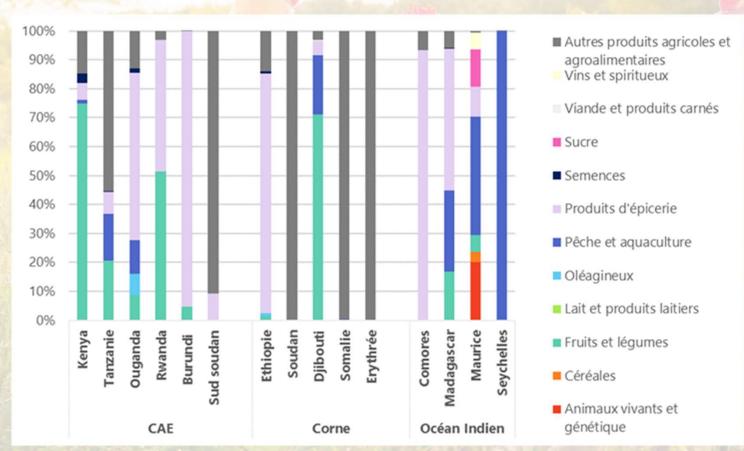

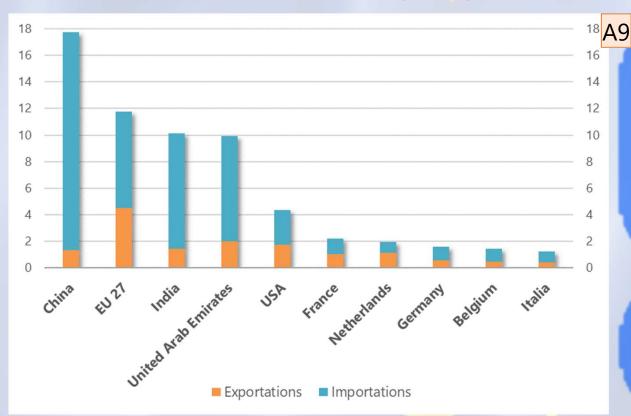

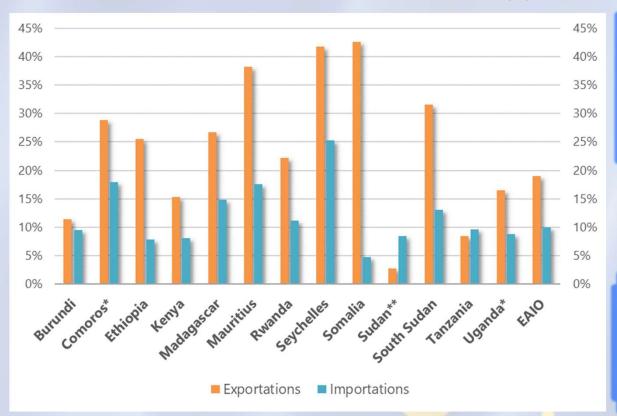

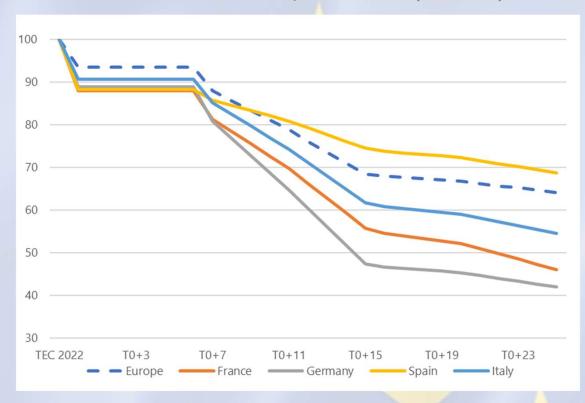

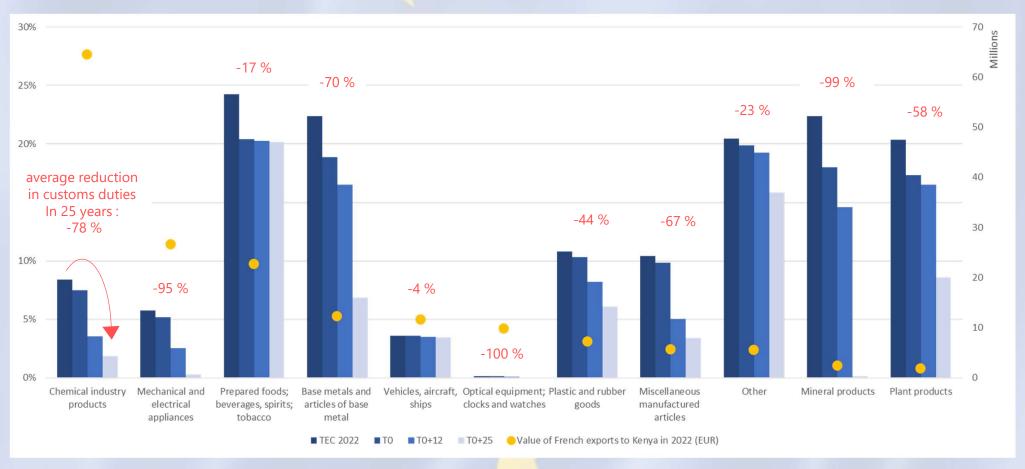
Expected fall in average Kenyan customs duty on products imported by each country:

- Germany (58%)
- France (54%)
- Italy (46%)
- European Union (36%)
- Spain (31%)

This lowering of customs duties should boost the competitiveness of companies on the Kenyan market vis-à-vis Kenya's other partners, notably the UK, whose companies have benefited from the UK-Kenya EPA since 2020.

France's two biggest export products should benefit from a significant reduction in customs duties

EXPECTED TREND IN KENYAN CUSTOMS DUTIES ON PRODUCTS EXPORTED TO FRANCE



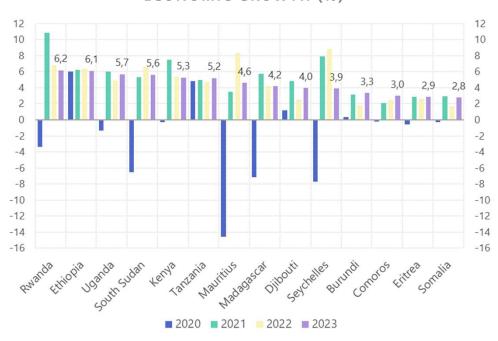

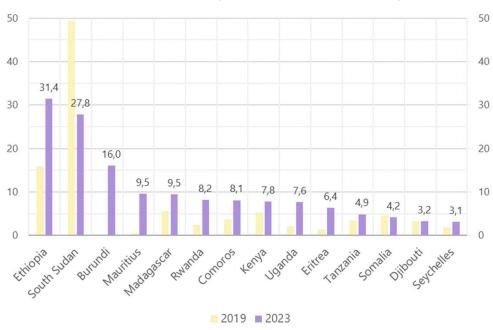

INFLATION (ANNUAL AVERAGE, %)

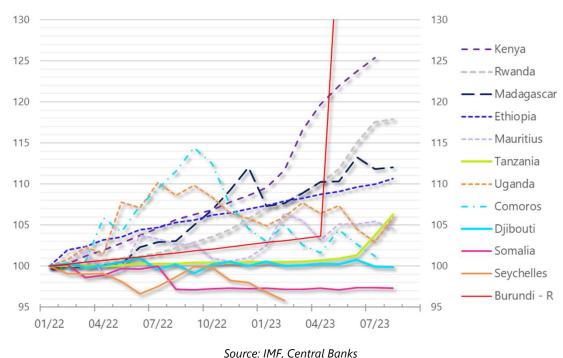

Strong depreciation of the currencies weighs on FX reserves

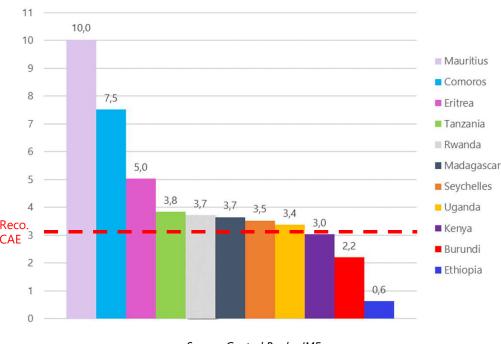

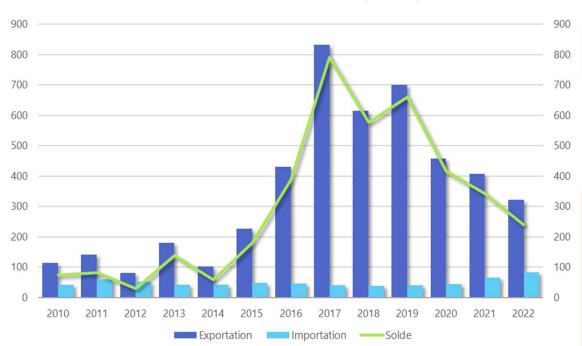

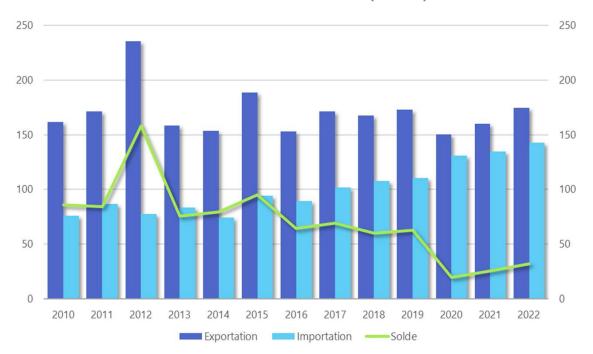

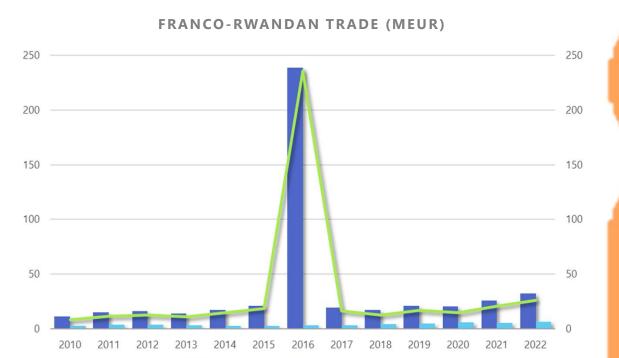

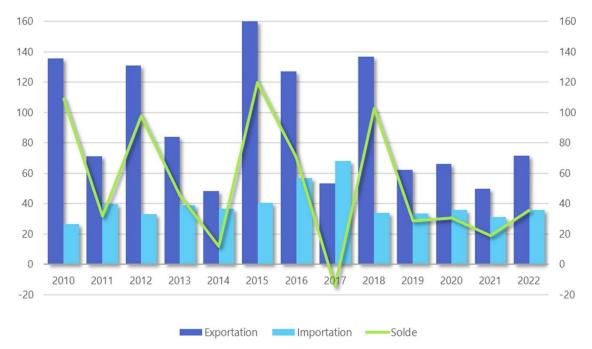

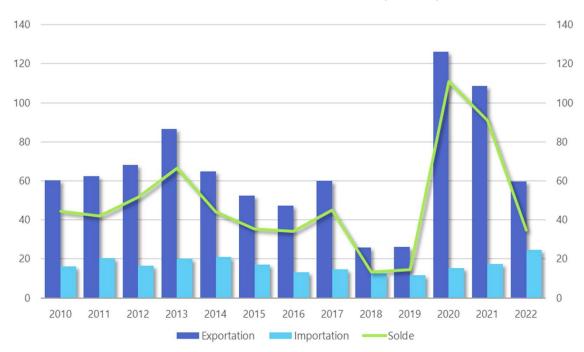

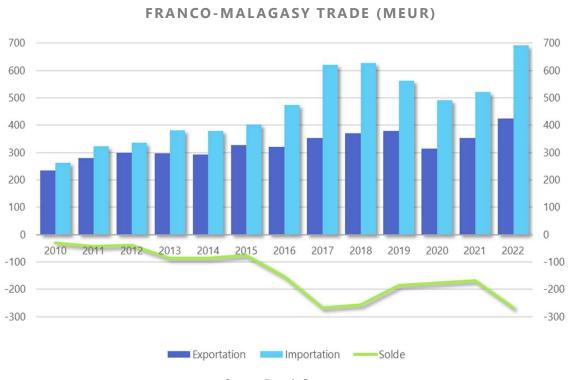
