#### THE PRIDE OF AFRICA

Agriculture contributes 20% of Ghanaian GDP– largest employing sector. Ghana has 5 agro economic regions allowing dynamic agriculture.

65% land area dedicated for agriculture, however less than 2% being irrigated.

Cocoa is the dominant agriculture sector, followed by cash crops like palm oil seeds, fruits and marginal crops like coconut rubber cashew etc.

## **GHANA & WEST AFRICA AGRIBUSINESS MARKET**

Ghana is becoming the centre of Business and Agriculture transformation in the West Africa region emerging as a trading, manufacturing, logistic hub with better and conducive trade policies & duty structure

Government schemes like Planting for Food & Jobs and Planing for Exports co-located with 1District 1 Factory scheme expected to attain agriculture & food processing self sufficiency and exports.

Agriculture Technology, undoubtedly the biggest demand and requirement in Ghana and WEST AFRICAN region after pharmaceuticals, is identified as key area to be worked for employment & development.

Targeted double digit growth in crop production like maize(30%); rice (49%); soybean (25%); and sorghum(28%) from current levels & create 75,000 new jobs, directly & indirectly.

Very low mechanisation in agriculture and food processing along with less than 2% irrigated land area dedicated for agriculture and shortage in storage facility are key need areas focussed to address to reach targeted goals

Ghana, with bilateral trade ties & agreements with its neighbours in West Africa and line of credits between Ghana and India & other countries, it is opportunistic to encash by supplying agriculture technology and requirements.




# **GHANAIAN FOOD & BEVERAGE MARKET**

- In 2021, food imports for Ghana were USD 3.76Bn approx. accounting to 17.5% roughly of the total imports during the year.
- In Ghana, population growth is increasing, bringing with it a sharp expansion of the country's middle class. More than half (51%) of the population live in urban areas, a figure that is expected to increase by 3.1% per annum in the coming years.
- This new trend in economic and demographic shifts has had interesting influence on the dietary preferences of Ghanaian consumers - the preference for processed foods.
- Despite the growing demand from consumers, Ghana's food processing sector remain largely underdeveloped. Although one would find a retail shop stocked with vast variety of processed foods, only a small percentage of the food consumed in Ghana are processed locally. The reality is that Ghana's processing industry remains low in capacity, with a wide gap that is filled by imports.
- Rice is one of the major food staples consumed in Ghana, but the production is way behind its actual consumption requirements. In 2017 Ghana produced 721,610 tons of rice but consumption, at 1.3Mn tones, In 2020 the rice demand in the country is estimated to be 1.5Mn tones.
- According to statistics from MoFA, between 2008 and 2020, paddy rice production was in the range of 302,000 MT and 987,000 MT (181,000 to 622,000 MT of milled rice) with large annual fluctuations The total rice consumption in 2020 amounted to about 1,450,000 MT which is equivalent to per capita consumption of about 45.0kg per annum.
- Ghana depends largely on imported rice to make up for the deficit in domestic rice supply. According to Agriculture Research for Sustainable Development (CIRAD, 2007) Ghana's domestic rice production meeting local demand declined to 24% in 2006 but increased to about 43% in 2020. Hence the need for local rice production, processing and importation is the need of the hour to meet the demand.
- In Ghana, 70% of the domestic consumption represents fruit & vegetable market. Vegetable consumption in Ghana is still relatively small but is expanding rapidly. Most important vegetables are tomato, pepper (both sweet and hot chilies), onion, and okra and their market and production has boomed recently.

- Despite being agriculture-centric, Ghana is not able to cater to its own domestic demands and has to import large number of crops to satisfy its domestic needs. Cereals crops are the most imported commodity in Ghana, and among them, rice and wheat are the leading imports.
- Food Processing industry is one of the major manufacturing industries in Ghana and West Africa is expected to grow by around 20% annually between 2020-2025 with domestic food processing and packaging in cocoa based and fruit-based industry expected to increase production and processing capacity
- Rapid urbanization and an evolving middle class have triggered food consumption patterns and demand for convenient and quality foods/ pack food. With urban lifestyle and standard of living getting better, the demand for FMCG and processed food through formal markets and super markets, is increasing exponentially

## **GHANAIAN FOOD IMPORTS IN 2020**



- Rice and cereals is the largest imported food commodity in Ghana touching USD 581Mn imports in 2020 – almost one-fifth of the Ghanaian food importation meeting the country's deficit rice demand. Other major food items include meat, fats & oils, confectionery sugar and processed food items.
- Vietnam is the largest supplier of food items to Ghana with over 14% share in Ghanaian food imports, followed by Canada, Belgium, China, Malaysia, USA, Russia. Thailand, Vietnam, India and Pakistan are the largest rice suppliers to Ghana.
